MEETING

AGENDA ITEM 3: OPPORTUNITY FOR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC TO SPEAK ON ITEMS NOT ON THE AGENDA (LIMIT TO 3 MINUTES)

Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton (Camp Pendleton) informed the group that they had met with City of Oceanside staff to visit areas in the watershed that drain from the base into the City of Oceanside. There were no significant illicit discharges identified. Camp Pendleton indicated that there is currently no flow coming from the reservoir at the top of Pilgrim Creek due to the level of water in the reservoir. A second outing with staff from both agencies is being planned for the future.

AGENDA ITEM 5: WATER QUALITY MONITORING UPDATE

Weston Solutions, Inc (Weston) provided an update of monitoring activities in the watershed. Weston is currently working with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) to obtain appropriate permissions to access the San Luis Rey River (SLR) Estuary for Bight '18 monitoring due to the presence of Snowy Plover habitat.

Bacteria TMDL dry weather monitoring was conducted five times during the month of June at OC-100. Lower River Goals monitoring was conducted once during June, at SLR25. The Benet Bridge site was dry. Changes to the monthly monitoring report were discussed, including the incorporation of the geometric mean calculations. Results are provided in Table 1 below.

Weston is working on preparing for wet weather MS4 monitoring and will be submitting appropriate permit applications to the City of Vista.

Weston provided a preliminary review of the wet weather MS4 results.

- Rainfall for the 2017-2018 wet weather season was much less than the previous monitoring years.
- Two events were monitored for the 2017-2018 wet weather MS4 program. During the first flush event in January two sites were monitored in the County's jurisdiction. The January event was a large storm event. The remaining three sites were monitored during a smaller event in February.
- Bacteria and chemistry results were reviewed as were trend assessment results.

AGENDA ITEM 6: 5-YEAR MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU) NOT TO EXCEED BUDGET

The County of San Diego (County) inquired if there were any questions regarding the MOU that was discussed at the June SLR WMA meeting. Participating agencies (PAs) noted that their questions had previously been answered. It was clarified that receiving water monitoring would be conducted in the new MS4 Permit cycle.

The County indicated that the expenditures for fiscal year 17-18 should be ready by the next meeting in August.

AGENDA ITEM 7: WQIP ANNUAL REPORT PLANNING SCHEDULE

Weston provided an update on Water Quality Improvement Plan (WQIP) Annual Report Planning, including a draft schedule. Comments on the schedule are due to Weston by August 8.

- In the coming months, D-MAX will meet individually with the PAs to discuss jurisdictional program information for the report. D-MAX suggested the agencies consider the projects and activities they would like highlighted in the report and provide photos for inclusion as well. The August 15th workgroup meeting will include a discussion on jurisdictional strategies and the Permit term end. The approved 2014 Integrated Report 303(d) listings will also be discussed at the next workgroup meeting.
- The executive summary (ES) for the report will be similar to last year's but with more graphics to highlight the key outcomes and successes and make the ES more public friendly.
- Weston requested PAs to submit field screening data as soon as possible, even if round 2 has not been completed. If data not received in time for first draft, it will be added to the second draft of the report. Results (if available) for dry weather will be presented to the group in October or between the first and second draft of the report.
- The final report is due to the PAs on December 17 and the Regional Board on January 31st.
- The Regional Board has not yet provided comments on the 2016-2017 WQIP Annual Report.

AGENDA ITEM 8: JURIS UPDATES

City of Oceanside Monitoring Update:

- The City of Oceanside is conducting the second round of dry weather monitoring. The first round was finished in June.
- Monitoring at their highest priority outfalls with persistent flow (HPPF) was recently completed.
- The City is organizing a clean-up of 2 sites on the SLR on Coastal Clean-up Day (September 15) using a contractor. An additional three sites on Buena Vista Creek (in the Carlsbad WMA) will be organized as a public clean-up event.
- The City has partnered with Heal the Bay to establish a NowCast station near the mouth of the SLR. The City is receiving weekly updates.

Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton Update:

- Camp Pendleton is considering hosting clean-up event similar to the City of Oceanside's.

County of San Diego Monitoring Update:

- The County is currently assessing their jurisdictional strategies
- On Friday, July 20th the County and other PAs are meeting with the Regional Board to discuss bacteria changes in the permit.
- The County discussed several ongoing studies including a dry weather study involving sampling for HF183 at flowing outfalls. Results are still pending.
- The County has purchased equipment to enhance remote dry weather continuous flow monitoring. By next year the County hopes to have the system in place to better inform management activities including public outreach.

City of Vista Monitoring Update:

- The City of Vista is almost finished developing their Survey123 form for monitoring.
- The City has finalized their selection of a laboratory for analysis of samples from their persistent flow sites.

- Brian Nemerow is transitioning into the lead watershed representative for the City of Vista

The County of San Diego discussed planning a field trip during or after an upcoming Workgroup meeting, potentially coinciding with Bight '18 sampling. Neil will coordinate with the other representatives.
