AGENDA ITEM 5: WATER QUALITY MONITORING UPDATE

Monitoring updates:

- For wet weather TMDL monitoring, 2 of 3 events have been captured this year: January 10th and February 28th. Dry weather sampling is complete for March. Exceedances are shown in in **Table 1**.
- Stormwater Monitoring Coalition (SMC) bioassessment sites are now being installed in advance of sampling this summer.
- The Bight 2018 Sediment Monitoring Workplan is currently out for comment. The Workplan contains one site for SLR, which is classified as a freshwater brackish site.
- The County is in the process of demobilizing sites from the Microbial Source Tracking Study. There was only one qualifying rain event this season, which was not targeted due to increased sediment runoff from burn areas of the Lilac Fire.

- The County is currently prioritizing Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE) sites and outfalls for follow up work this summer.
- The City of Vista has budgeted money for 2018-19 to examine outfalls for persistent flow monitoring, and potentially source tracking.
- The City of Oceanside is outsourcing their dry weather MS4 outfall monitoring this summer. The first round of screenings will begin in May. The second round will occur in either July or August.
- The copermitees will keep each other informed of their efforts and coordinate where possible.

AGENDA ITEM 6: JURISDICTIONAL UPDATE

City of Vista

- Based on comments from the Carlsbad WMA meeting the Permit is likely going to be delayed until early 2019. This brings up issues with the Trash Order and when to begin implementation of Track 1 and Track 2. Two main items that need clarification from the Regional Water Board are:
 - Priority land use substitution for Track 1.
 - What components, particularly related to monitoring, the Regional Water Board is expecting for Track 2.

City of Oceanside

- Reported that Project Clean Water website links are properly working. The GIS links are up and running, Jurisdictional Runoff Management Plan links are working, and monitoring data is properly functioning.

County of San Diego

- The County has been reaching out to NGOs that operate in the SLR watershed to make them aware of the WQIP and current strategies in the watershed. If our current work in the Watershed parallels any NGOs efforts, a partnership may be pursued.
- Regarding future Workgroup meetings, the Workgroup discussed a field trip to locations of interest in the Watershed. The County will put together an agenda and potential dates for a Workgroup outing.
