II. Review and Discuss the SCWRRP Bacterial Regrowth Study

-Karen and Mayela gave a brief description of the proposed SCWRRP Bacterial Regrowth Study (Study).

-Mayela stated that the funding for the Study in LA ran out, but the Copermittees in San Diego set aside money in the regional budget to continue the program down here.

-There are strict criteria for drains to qualify for the program

Primary Criteria

-There is safe access

-The storm drain has a nuisance flow; also good if algae is present

-The location must be underground (with manhole access)

-The location must be above the tidal prism

Secondary Criteria

-The nuisance flow reaches the beach or discharges directly into the ocean

-It would be favorable if the beach has entero AB411 exceedances

-Mayela has a list of potential sites where receiving water had entero AB411 exceedances

-There will be required Copermittee staff involvement consisting of placing the concrete "coupon" in the pipe and taking the samples (confined space required).

-Targeted start date – April 2009

-Jurisdictions submitted possible sites and they were initially ranked by the CSDM group:

1. EH – 420 (Moonlight Beach)
2. CSO – 037
3. CSDM – SO6, S12
4. EH – 390 (Seascape Outfall)

-Each jurisdiction agreed to supply information on their submitted storm drains and criteria to submit to SCWRRP – Include exceedances.
